## **Fay-Penn Economic Development Council Closes More Than \$1.37 Million in Loans in 2025, Driving Business Growth and Job Retention Across Fayette County**

**Fayette County, PA** — The Fay-Penn Economic Development Council (Fay-Penn) announced the successful closing of multiple loans through its revolving loan fund in 2025, providing critical financing to local businesses and organizations while advancing job creation, job retention, and long-term community investment throughout Fayette County.

In total, Fay-Penn facilitated more than **\$1.37 million in direct loan funding**, leveraging almost **\$2 million in total project investment** in 2025 across the retail, education, food service, nonprofit, and small business sectors. These investments resulted in the **creation of 31 jobs and the retention of 56 existing positions**, reinforcing the strength and resilience of the county's economy.

Projects supported in 2025 include financing for May's Country Store in Normalville to expand its existing facility; Mount Moriah Christian School to purchase a campus in Uniontown for the operation of its high school; the acquisition of Darby's Restaurant to ensure continued operations and employment; an office buildout for Lenny Pasquale Customs, LLC within its car restoration business; and the purchase of a new building for the Greater Connellsville Chamber of Commerce to house its operations.

"Fay-Penn's loan fund is designed to fill financing gaps and help businesses move forward with projects that strengthen our local economy," said Jerrod Murtha, Executive Director of Fay-Penn. "The projects completed in 2025 clearly demonstrate the impact that strategic, locally focused lending can have on job growth, business stability, and community energy."

Through its loan fund, Fay-Penn continues to offer flexible financing solutions that help businesses expand, transition ownership, invest in facilities, and stabilize operations—particularly when traditional financing options alone may not meet project needs.
